Evaluations: All horses evaluated must show proof of registration from a FEIF recognized country and a copy of this proof of registration must accompany the evaluation application on or before the deadline. Proof of registration can be the following:

A copy of the original Certificate of Registration issued from a FEIF recognized country or if the horse was imported from Iceland, a copy of the original Certificate of Origin and Pedigree.

Domestic-bred horses may be fully evaluated only if registered with the USIHC or if you have a letter from the Registrar stating that the horse is accepted for registration (all documents are in to the Registry and approved).

All horses evaluated must have a micro chip. (A freeze brand will not suffice) Micro chips must be inserted by their individual vet before the event. The Avid chip is suggested. This micro-chip will be read prior to the evaluation process.

Radiographic examination of the distal tarsus is required for stallions before entering the first breeding show from the age of five (5) years. Compliance requirements are included; however, you can also read them at <http://www.icelandics.org/breeding/spavin.pdf>

Your completed applications must be received by Flugnir Icelandic Horse Association c/o Hanna Geyer, Treasurer, 22108 Ruh Road, Kiel, WI 53042 with your check by June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010 at the latest as all information/data sent to us must be verified and entered on the Judge's computer.

All farms which have a horse evaluated will be allowed to display the FEIF symbol by the farm name in future advertising to indicate participation in this event.

The following may be evaluated:

1. Full Evaluation: (Conformation and Riding).

(a) Stallions, mares and geldings born in 2006 or before.

2. Conformation Evaluation Only.

(a) Stallions, mares and geldings born 2007 or before.

3. Young Horse Evaluation: untrained young stallions, mares and geldings born in 2006 or younger.

3. Rules and Regulations. Rules and regulations concerning evaluations (Breeding Shows) are available at the FEIF website ([www.feif.org](http://www.feif.org)) under "Breeding Shows – General Rules". These rules will be strictly adhered to.

6. Arrival and Departure Time. Horses may enter the grounds from Sunday, June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2010 and must be off the premises by Monday, June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2010 unless other arrangements have been made.

7. Stalls, Paddocks, Bedding, Hay, and Feed. Stabling is available by separate reservation form to be sent to Winterhorse Park. Please see STABLING form for cost information.

9. Requirements for Evaluations.

(a) Conformation. To be evaluated on Conformation the horse should be able to stand reasonably quiet in a natural position and to be led reasonably straight in walk and trot.

(b) Riding Traits. To be evaluated on Riding Traits, the horse will be ridden in walk, trot, tolt, canter and pace (if available) on a straightaway of approximately 700 feet for a length determined by the Judges.

10. Professional Riders. We anticipate at least 3 professional riders available to present your horse in the riding and/or conformation segment of the evaluation. You may contact them directly:

11. RV Parking is not available on Winterhorse grounds. There are two camping areas in the very near vicinity. Pinewoods Campground or Ottawa Lake Campground. Reservation information can be found at [www.wiparks.net](http://www.wiparks.net) or call 888-8947-2757

12. Hay & Shavings. Can be purchased if needed at Winterhorse Park. Grass hay \$5 per bale, bedding \$6 per bale.

13. A Farrier and Veterinarian will be either on the grounds or on call for the duration of the event. Contact will be posted in the program and at the stables.

14. Accommodations. We have arranged a block of rooms for \$89 per night for double occupancy at the LaQuinta Hotel in Delafield. When you call the LaQuinta please mention that you are making your reservation under the block of rooms reserved for the "Icelandic Horse Evaluation". Reservations must be guaranteed to your individual credit card and must be received by 5-16-10 at the latest. This rate will not be available after that date. There is also another block of rooms arranged at the Sleep Inn in Mukwonago for \$98 per night. Again, please mention the "Icelandic Horse Evaluation".

Reservations should be made as soon as possible. **DEAD LINE FOR THE EVALUATIONS, COMPETITION AND STABLING ARE DUE JUNE 1<sup>ST</sup>, 2010.** You will not be able to have a horse evaluated without the pre-registration. There will be a fee imposed for late registrations for the Summermot competition.

15. Food. We will provide food concession for the event. Proceeds will help Kevin Draeger, Flugnir youth member, with his travel expenses to attend the FEIF Youth Cup this summer in Denmark. There are also

restaurants in Eagle, North Prairie, Mukwonago, Delafield and Oconomowoc. Information will be posted in the lounge

16. Friday Evening Dinner. We have reserved The Oconomowoc Lake Club on June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2010 at 6:30 pm. The buffet dinner will take place in the Ball Room/upper deck overlooking beautiful Oconomowoc Lake. Dinner will include tempura battered cod, grilled and marinated free range chicken, seafood chowder, a variety of salads and vegetables along with key lime tarts for desert. 18. **IMPORTANT:** Your completed application, check and copy of the original Certificate of Registration or a copy of the original Certificate of Origin (if horse is from Iceland) must be received by Flugnir by June 1<sup>st</sup> the latest! Your stabling reservation must be received by Winterhorse by June 1<sup>st</sup> at the latest.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Current 2010 Coggins and Health Certificate are required for each Horse from out of state. No horse is to be unloaded off the trailer until current Coggins and Health Certificate for each horse is presented to and approved by a Staff Member of the Evaluations show Committee. (Horses coming in from Minnesota are exempt from the Health Certificate.)

Horses without current Coggins and Health Certificate will be turned away.
